Preparing for Dedication Sunday

Baby Dedication is really for parents! It does not save your child or guarantee salvation. It does bear witness to your resolve to intentionally team them the ways of your God.

During the service you will be asked to introduce your family, share your child's life verse or a piece of scripture. The church will then engage in corporate prayer for your family. Although the dedication will be brief, the preparation is not.

Steps for Preparing

- 1- Pray
- 2- Create a Parenting Plan for your child
- 3- Set goals for your child- Focus on Character
- 4- Clarify your "Family Way" Discipline and Rules
- 5- Think about what you will say- How will you present your child and your intentions? Select a life verse (see page 5)
- 6- Send a picture of your child to <u>lisa@kingsharbor.org</u> to be shown during the dedication.

Five Promises to Make

- 1- Do you recognize your child as a gift of God and give heartfelt thanks for God's blessings?
- 2- Do you desire your child to the Lord who gave them to you, surrendering all wordly claims upon their lives in the hope that they will belong wholly to God?
- 3- Do you pledge as parents that, with God's fatherly help, you will bring up your children in the discipline and instructions of the Lord, making every reasonable effort, with patience and love, to build the Word of God, the character of Christ and the joy of the Lord into their lives?
- 4- Do you promise to provide, through God's blessing, for the physical, emotional, intellectual and spiritual needs of your child, looking to your own heavenly Father for wisdom, love and strength to serve and not to use them?
- 5- Do you promise, God helping you, to make it your regular prayer, that by God's grace, your children will come to trust in Jesus Christ alone for the forgiveness of their sins and for the fulfillment of all His promises to them, even eternal life; and in this faith follow Jesus as Lord and obey his teachings?
